

NEW DETAILS FOR THE NJ TURNPIKE CAPITAL PLAN HEARINGS

Today the New Jersey Turnpike Authority is hosting two hearings on proposed changes to its toll schedule. The new tolls are expected to fund a \$24 billion capital program, which would be more than three times as large as the 2008 - 2018 NJ Turnpike/Garden State Parkway widening program.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority's website says the new toll schedule will fund a long list of capital improvements, including:

- \$3.5 billion dualizing of the Laderman Memorial Bridge
- \$3 billion widening of the Turnpike between Interchanges 14 - 14A
- \$2.6 billion Parkway & Turnpike Bridge Rehabilitation/Replacement Program
- \$2.5 billion widening of the Parkway between Interchanges 142 - 154
- \$1.4 billion flood zone remediation project in Great Egg Harbor
- \$1.35 billion widening of the Parkway between Interchanges 98 - 125
- \$1.3 billion widening of the Turnpike between Interchanges 14A - 14C
- \$900 million all electronic toll collection conversion on the Parkway & Turnpike
- \$800 million widening of the Parkway between Interchanges 129 - 142
- \$750 million widening of the Parkway between Interchanges 154 - 163
- \$400 million ITS Infrastructure and Software Upgrade Program
- \$400 million widening of the Turnpike between Interchanges 1 - 2
- \$400 million widening of the Turnpike between Interchanges 2 - 3
- \$300 million widening of the Turnpike between Interchanges 3 - 4
